### Etymology

From Ancient Greek ἄγγαρος (*ángaros*, “Persian mounted courier”). Confer ἄγγελος (*ángelos*).

### Noun

**angarius** *m* (genitive **angariī**); *second declension*

- courier, messenger

### Declension

Second declension.

<b>Case</b>	<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
<b><u>Nominative</u></b>	<b>angarius</b>	angariī
<b><u>Genitive</u></b>	angariī angari <sup>1</sup>	angariōrum
<b><u>Dative</u></b>	angariō	angariīs
<b><u>Accusative</u></b>	angarium	angariōs
<b><u>Ablative</u></b>	angariō	angariīs
<b><u>Vocative</u></b>	angarie	angariī

<sup>1</sup>Found in older Latin (until the Augustan Age).
