Etymology

From Byzantine Greek κατεπάνω (*katepánō*, literally “[the one] placed at the top, or the topmost”).

Noun

catepan (*plural* catepans)

1. (*historical*) The governor of a catepanate such as the Catepanate of Italy, a Byzantine province.

Translations

- Greek:
 - Ancient: κατεπάνω (*katepánō*)
- Italian: catapano ^(it)
- Russian: κατεπάνη *м* (*katepán*)

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
