### Etymology 1

From Proto-Italic \*hundō (with fūsus for \*fussus after fūdī), from Proto-Indo-European \*ǵʰewd-. The change h- > f- is irregular. Cognates include Ancient Greek χέω (khéō) and Old English gēotan.

### Verb

**fundō** (*present infinitive fundere, perfect active fūdī, supine fūsum*); *third conjugation, limited passive*

1. (transitive) I pour out, shed
2. (military) I rout, scatter
3. (transitive) I found, make by smelting
4. (transitive, figuratively) I moisten, wet

6. (transitive) I utter

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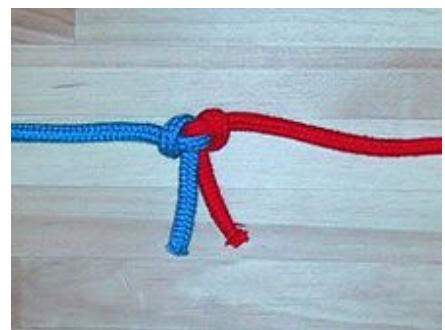
